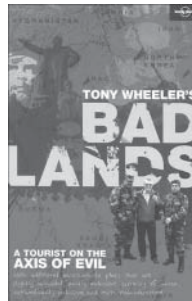

Bad Lands

They are all countries Tony Wheeler can claim he's been to in these troubling times when all these countries have violated human rights laws and are considered dangerous. While looking at these countries' policies toward terrorism, foreign policy, and human rights, Tony Wheeler decides what truly makes a country evil. He also talks about the locals, including topics like the weather, hotels, museum, and, even, shops. This book includes stories, as well as re-



searched facts about these countries—all of which will interest the reader, who probably knows very little of these countries that are so out of touch with the rest of the world. All are considered evil and dangerous, but Tony's adventure he takes the reader on gives a new meaning to that word.
