Down and Out on Murder Mile

Extremely graphic and with perfect pace throughout, *Down and Out on Murder Mile* gives an utterly honest and true look into the lives of drug addicts who are trying to make it as something other than a drug addict. The protagonist and his wife find themselves on Murder Mile in London, as a last vestige after their previous attempt to “settle down” somewhere failed. Murder Mile ends up being the worst possible place for the two, especially since the man is attempting, at least somewhat, to get a hold of himself and grow out of his addictions.

Told with unwavering honesty, it is the perfect description of the lifestyle, and not surprising from a man who has lived it. *Down and Out on Murder Mile* is a force to be reckoned with.
