The Girls Next Door

In this PG guide to all things *Girls Next Door*, fans of the show probably won't find a whole lot of new information. There are lots of pictures, both from the episodes and behind the scenes, recaps of the first three seasons episodes (though each does have comments from one of the girls), quotes from the show's staff, descriptions of the mansion and its grounds and random items that feel thrown in (recipes, directory of shops and restaurants visited during the show). In the beginning of the book, each girl has their own chapter, with some childhood photos juxtaposed against the Playboy era ones. The girls' centerfold questionnaires are reproduced, as is a timeline of a typical day. There is no dirt, no controversy, no new ground covered that you couldn't find elsewhere. Really a book for die-hard fans only.
