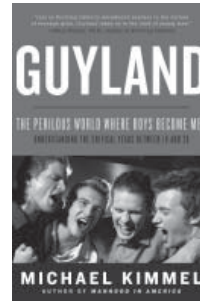

Guyland

Though much of what he has to say in *Guyland* is not incorrect, Kimmel seems to have made the problem of non-maturing young men into a much less daunting one to conquer than it actually is. *Guyland* begins to explore the strange world of young males who aren't little kids, but most definitely are not men, either. Dudes, bros, guys, whatever tag that is associated with the group, everyone knows them, everyone has them in their lives, and they are often out of place even though they are trying so hard to fit in.



Offering solutions that, though they may help, will in the long run not be the ultimate answers to guiding yourself or a friend or relative through “guyland” and into manhood, Kimmel has nonetheless scratched deeper than most when concerning this subject. No one book, and especially not this one, can turn a guy into a man, but *Guyland* may be of use to some.
