Happy Gloves

Twenty-two fairly easy sewing projects to be done with knit gloves. The first part of the book is set up like a child's counting book, each project pictured, with some hand-drawn artwork and a line of text ("A white-as-snow polar bear comes eighth.") Each of the projects has clear instructions, though some experience at sewing would probably be helpful.

Parental supervision would also be needed for smaller children. Even though the book suggests using old gloves, just due to the number of projects, and the variety of colors needed (or wanted), you'll probably find yourself glove shopping. The variety of projects to do is excellent, from the above mentioned white-as-snow polar bear, to a car, a teapot and cup, and penguin. Not only will the projects keep you busy, but the end result will keep small children busy for hours (days, weeks etc.)
