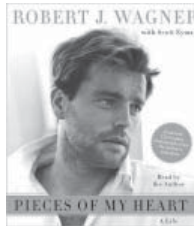

Pieces of My Heart

By Robert J. Wagner

William Morrow, \$25.95, 336 pages

With one of the longest and most successful careers that Hollywood has ever seen, spanning from the age of epic productions, such as “The Ten Commandments,” and the reign of Liz Taylor, up until, inclusively, today’s film. A career so long in the spotlight, as might be expected, holds within it quite the variety of drama—everything from shining in that light, to it making you sweat, to it still drawing attention to you when you go into a downward spiral, and even to it slowly fading out.



Wagner opens up about all of it, everything, from the most joyous peaks to the most devastatingly shameful and difficult periods, and does so without regard to his reputation.

Admittedly, Wagner is not the end-all be-all of writers, and does not break literary ground with his offering—fortunately, though, his life has been so insane that it practically writes itself. Ever interesting and filled to the brim with tension and intrigue, *Pieces of my Heart* is not the easiest book to put down.
